I don't live here.

He doesn't drive. We don't play chess. I don't live here.

Negative I/you/we/they don't (do not) live he/she/it doesn't (does not) live

There is no -s at the end of the verb in the third person singular: He doesn't drive. (Not He doesn't drives.)
